



Dazhāw and welcome to the first annual Augusto! Children's Festival! We acknowledge that this event is on the land of the Champagne and Aishihik First Nations and thank them for allowing us to hold this event in their traditional territory. We are proud and excited to be founding Yukon's only dedicated art and music festival for children. Whether you are a child, family, volunteer or presenter, there will be much to entertain you throughout the weekend!

With a focus on zero waste, our theme this year will circle around recreating with what we usually throw away. Let your imagination be your guide! Where possible, workshops will have an emphasis on upcycling, repurposing found objects and transforming waste materials into expressive art explorations and musical instruments. The Augusto! Children's Festival will strive to be a zero waste event with stations for compost and recycling. No bottled water or other bottled products will be sold on site so be sure to bring your own water bottle!

PERFORMING ARTS - SHOWS AND WORKSHOPS

Dakwākāda Dancers

Based in Haines Junction, Yukon, the Dakwākāda Dancers have been teaching young people in Southern Tutchone and Tlingit cultures through the tradition of song and dance for more than 20 years. With a focus on youth, the Dakwākāda Dancers include child performers who begin as young as two years of age. Audiences witness the older youth and adults demonstrate leadership and the Southern Tutchone culture alive, vibrant, and being passed down to new generations – native and non-native. Each song is introduced with its origin and story, thus the audience understands the importance of what is being shared. The Dakwākāda Dancers are ambassadors of their culture, their community, and the Yukon Territory.

Flyin' Bob

Flyin' Bob – balancer, juggler, highly skilled goofball and rainbow skywriter takes you on a visit to the one man three ring circus in his mind. Join us Saturday night for a gem of a show full of hilarious antics! Try out your Circus Skills! Flyin' Bob has taught thousands of people across Canada how to walk on stilts, juggle, balance, throw a diabolo, spin a plate and much more! Warning, learning circus skills is highly addictive. You may end up running away to join the circus!

Claire Ness

Claire Ness, a free-spirited Yukoner born and raised, makes her living as a singer/songwriter, actor, clown, vaudevillian, circus teacher, cabaret performer and



VISUAL ART WORKSHOPS

Color Your Own Cup with Monika Steputh

Have fun with local artist Monika Steputh to color your own hand thrown and bisque fired clay cup! After painting your cup with lead free paint, they will be glaze fired overnight and participants will end up with their all handmade pottery cup, colored during the workshop. They are fully food and dishwasher safe. Ages 5 and 6 must be accompanied by an adult.

Be a Recycling Superhero with Marty Ritchie

It's trash, it's paint...no it's Captain Crusher! Let your imagination fly as you create your own superhero personality and transform ordinary materials into a fantastic outfit. Hack! Splash! Press! Marty will help you to cut a cape, design your own superhero symbol, paint it and attach it to your outfit. Then you can blast off and save the world from environmental enemies. Marty Ritchie is our own local crafting superhero. For the last twenty-three years she has been using her powerful imagination to transform Haines Junction children into creative geniuses.



Recycled Papermaking with Helen O'Connor

Make beautiful handmade paper art using recycled paper, kitchen blenders, pressed flowers, pictures and string! Helen uses handmade paper in new and unexpected ways to teach participants to create sculptural works of art. Helen is a full time artist and has enjoyed teaching art workshops for children for over 25 years.

Needle Felting with Cai Krikorian

Create amazing soft art work with Kai! Warm fuzzy fun with needle felting will get you rolling on a new craft adventure. Create an idea with raw wool on felt sheets and then needle felt the wool onto the felt sheets. Images of nearby mountains, flowers or animals can turn into a small wall hanging or card. Kai has taught this unique art through several artist in the school sessions. Kids under the age of 6 must have adult accompaniment for this workshop due to the inherent risks of stabbing very sharp needles into a very stable surface!

Cartooning with Blair Thorson

Awaken the cartoonist in all of us! Blair will lead this workshop with a step by step instruction of how to draw a cartoon character while participants follow along to completion. A variety of illustrations are available depending on the age of the participants and the complexity of the cartoons. Ages 5-6 must be accompanied by an adult.

OTHER WORKSHOPS

Introduction to Judo Workshop

Check out Judo with instructors from Judo Yukon! This introduction to Judo is a great opportunity for children to try judo – judo is described as a sport, martial art, self-defense, recreation, fitness and health activity, and as a way of life. Planning is underway to bring a Judo program to Haines Junction starting this fall!

RoboCritters on the Loose!

Ever been curious about creating a pet with wheels? How about a moveable snack tray? Come on out and build yourself a RoboCritic! These little introductions to robotics, mechanics and electronics will set you on the STEM road to future engineering projects. Ages 5-6 must be accompanied by an adult.

Small Stones/Short Poems with Kathy Munro

Kathy Munro will scoop up budding writers for a workshop called 'Small Stones/Short Poems'. Explore the world of words using re-purposed magazines and newspapers to create collage poetry! Try your hand at writing short poetry and then decorate a bookmark around the words! For younger participants, we will make paper bag books and one-tag books. Ages 5 and 6 must be accompanied by an adult.

Improv with Shahin MoComedy

Be spontaneous and sign up for an improv workshop with Shahin MoComedy! Totally unplanned and unscripted, come prepared to have fun and work together to create a story without the use of an already prepared written script! Say yes, think fast, gain confidence and bring out the true performer inside of you!! Ages 5 and 6 should be accompanied by an adult.



OTHER ACTIVITIES

Toddler Town - For children 4 and under, Toddler Town will operate in the Arena Mezzanine from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Saturday and 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on Sunday. Structured activities, snacks, roving performers and short concerts will keep this younger set entertained.

Free Swimming - The Shawkak Valley Community Pool will be available to all weekend pass holders Saturday daytime and Sunday morning during their opening hours at no charge to children wearing a festival bracelet!

Button Making - Make your own Klwane National Park button with Parks Canada staff on Saturday from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. in the Convention Centre Foyer.

Face Painting - Make sure to look your best at the fest! Face painting will be ongoing in the Convention Centre Foyer Saturday daytime 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and Sunday daytime 10:00a.m. - 1:00 p.m.

Film Screenings and Storytelling - Select film screenings and storytelling will be ongoing Saturday and Sunday daytime. Times and locations to be announced at the festival!




